

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Goal 1: Academic Excellence by fostering learning through ICT

Values-based Education creates a strong learning environment that enhances academic achievement and develops students' social and relationship skills throughout their lives. The positive outcomes are achieved through teaching-learning methods blended with ethical values and cross-domain research in cutting-edge technologies. This leads to the all-round personality development of the students. It also provides social capacity to students, equipping them with social and relationship skills, intelligence and attitude to succeed at every aspect of their lives. A high quality of academic excellence can provide value-added experience for the students.

Strategies:

1. Curriculum Enrichment and Value Addition: PRPPCOP is committed to fulfilling its vision and mission by producing skilled human resources through high-quality education, fostering creativity, and creating innovative learning environments. Affiliated with SGBAU, Amravati, the college strictly follows the university's academic calendar for B Pharmacy and M Pharmacy programs, which includes class commencement, end-semester exams, and Institution Holidays. The curriculum, designed by the Pharmacy Council of India (PCI) and periodically updated by the university board of studies, reviewed annually based on stakeholder feedback. The academic Dean prepares the institution's academic calendar, and it will be reviewed by IQAC & Principal. They meet before each semester to plan and discuss curriculum delivery, including timetables and workload distribution. The academic Dean along with IQAC, Exam In charge, HOD & Principal reviews and monitors these aspects. The institution integrates professional ethics, gender, human values, environment, and sustainability into the curriculum through relevant courses and co-curricular and extracurricular activities. PRPPCOP prioritizes providing advanced infrastructural facilities to enhance both teaching and learning. The campus boasts a lush green environment and state-of-the-art infrastructure, including well-equipped labs, ICT-enabled classrooms, seminar halls, a computer lab, and a sophisticated library with access to extensive e-learning



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resources. To support sports and co-curricular activities, the college has significant infrastructure, including playgrounds and a gymnasium. The budget for infrastructure and learning resources is allocated annually based on committee recommendations. Regular reviews and updates of IT resources and facilities ensure they meet modern standards. Stakeholder feedback is regularly collected to continuously improve and maintain the quality of educational and support facilities, fostering an environment conducive to curriculum enrichment and value addition.

2. Pedagogy and Delivery Modes: In addition to traditional classroom teaching, students engage in student-centric methods such as laboratory practicals, research projects, and industrial visits. Pharmaceutical Industries/Hospital training after semester VI (Third Year) and before commencement of Semester VII (Final Year) helps bridge the gap between academia and industry. Students are encouraged to participate in national and international competitions, and field visits (Industrial visits, visits to medicinal gardens and pharmacies). Teachers use ICT tools like PowerPoint PPT's, Videos, Google Meet, Google Classroom, and Google Forms etc. Before starting the syllabus every teacher draft course outcomes of each course which are communicated to students with an academic session plan. The general working of IT Resources, Review of IT Infrastructure Performed Annually according to the plan of action and approval of finance committee. The availability of sophisticated instrumentation supports practical learning, experiments, projects, and research by students, enhancing their educational experience. Internal assessment includes continuous evaluation based on performance, interaction, and attendance, while external assessment is conducted by SGBAU Amravati. The evaluation process involves internal and external exams with transparent mechanisms, grievance redressal systems, and CCTV surveillance to prevent malpractices. Student performance is evaluated through Program Outcomes (POs) and Course Outcomes (COs), using correlation levels 1, 2, 3 to determine Learning Outcomes at the end of each course also Faculties and students are encouraged for MOOC- SWAYAM-NPTEL Certification.

Institution Preparedness for NEP

- 1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary: Our Institute strategically embraces the NEP 2020 vision by fostering high-quality, multidisciplinary pharmacy education that nurtures global citizenship. Emphasizing cognitive and higher-order skills, along with social, ethical, and emotional capacities, we integrate an inclusive curriculum, diverse pedagogy, and technological innovations. Through SWAYAM, we offer MOOCs, benefiting students and staff, and demonstrate proactive NEP implementation. Our holistic education strategy includes value-based programs, skill development, physical fitness, and community outreach initiatives, such as health camps and blood donation drives. Aligned with Pharmacy Council of India standards and assessed by SGBAU, our curriculum blends science and humanities, enhancing environmental education and community engagement. Practice School & Projects in final semesters address societal health challenges, embodying our commitment to impactful multidisciplinary education and exemplary teaching and research practices.
- 2. Academic bank of credits (ABC): Our Institute strategically plans to implement the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) as per NEP 2020. We will register on www.nad.digilocker.gov.in and prominently share the ABC link on our website to encourage student registration. Existing students are enrolled, and new students will register annually. While current PCI regulations do not allow dual degree/twinning programs and credit transfers, we are open to introducing such programs under the State Regulatory Authority's (SRA) guidance. We will comply with any additional instructions or directives from relevant authorities as they are issued.
- 3. Skill Development: The Institute is strategically nurturing skilled professionals for the pharma and healthcare industry. Beyond UG/PG programs, the Institute offers add-on certificate courses, emphasizing value education through co-curricular and extracurricular activities for holistic student development. NSS unit and extracurricular committees engage in social activities, fostering universal values through events like Republic Day and Independence Day. Institute host expert lectures on constitutional responsibilities and celebrate key national figures' anniversaries. Our career guidance and placement cell organizes technical and soft skill training, customized programs, hands-on workshops, and seminars to enhance employability and communication skills. The Institute partner with industries for practical experience, collaborate with agencies for soft skill development and ensure students in Semesters VII and VIII enroll in relevant technical subjects on SWAYAM-NPTEL. Our recognition as an ACTIVE LOCAL CHAPTER underscores our commitment to excellence.



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- 4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course): Institute strategically integrates the Indian Knowledge System by promoting regional languages and cultural connections. We issue circulars in local languages and celebrate Marathi & Hindi Bhasha Diwas, where teaching is conducted in colloquial languages. Our annual cultural festival, "PHARMACLONS," showcases Indian dance, drama, and music. Institute notices, and correspondences are in Marathi. Our pharmacy curriculum integrates traditional medicine systems like Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani, and folk medicine under 'Pharmacognosy,' covering preparation and evaluation methods of Ayurvedic dosage forms. Institute actively promotes research in Ayurveda, Herbal Medicines, and Nutraceuticals. E-Learning modules, especially ICMR-NIN, will be used to educate students on practical nutritional knowledge and cultural practices, reinforcing our commitment to blending modern advancements with traditional wisdom.
- **5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):** PRPPCOP strategically implements Outcome-Based Education (OBE) to foster student-centric teaching and learning. We align with the National Board of Accreditation (NBA) defined Program Outcomes (POs) and formulate Course Outcomes (COs) based on Bloom's Taxonomy. Each CO is crafted for specific topics/modules in consultation with the Head of the Department (HOD) and mapped to POs to indicate the level of correlation. Subject teachers ensure students understand the COs before commencing each course, promoting a clear understanding of expected achievements. This strategic approach ensures that our educational practices are outcome-focused and aligned with national standards.
- **6. Distance education/online education:** PRPPCOP strategically embraced distance and online education during the COVID pandemic, utilizing ICT tools such as Google Classroom, Zoom, Google Meet, and Webex. Over nearly two years, Institute conducted the entire Teaching-Learning-Assessment process online to mitigate academic disruptions. Student communication was enhanced through WhatsApp groups, and we went beyond syllabus by organizing Webinars and Workshops with industry and academic experts via ZOOM and Google Meet. Currently, students are encouraged to pursue online skill development courses on SWAYAM/NPTEL Platforms. Our institution's recognition as an ACTIVE SWAYAM-NPTEL LOCAL CHAPTER underscores our proactive commitment to facilitating comprehensive online education opportunities for our students.
